
RULES & REGULATIONS

- CHECK-IN time is 2:00 p.m. for campsites and 4:00 p.m. for rental cabins.
- CHECK-OUT time is 11:00 a.m. for both campsites and rental cabins. Extended check-outs are available until 6:00 p.m. (subject to availability).
- VISITOR POLICY: Campers are responsible for their guests. Visitors must leave by 10:00 p.m. unless registered as overnight guests. Visitors arriving after 9:00 p.m. must register as overnight guests. All guests four years of age and older must purchase a guest pass. Unregistered guests and their hosts will be asked to leave the
- CHILDREN under 18 are the responsibility of their parents or guardian need to return to their campsite at quiet time.
- QUIET TIME IS 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.
- CAMPFIRES must never be left unattended and trash burning is prohibited. Campfires must always be contained within the designated fire ring. Safety is first!
- VEHICLES must have a valid pass at all times in the campground. Please see the park office if you did not receive a pass at check-in. All drivers must have a valid state driver's license.
- LEARNING PERMITS are not accepted. Open containers are not allowed in any vehicle. Driving any vehicle while intoxicated will result in eviction. Follow the instructions of all park team members and park signage.
- AMENITIES have specific sets of rules. Please refer to the signage at each location. Outdoor amenities close at dusk.
- THE SPEED LIMIT throughout the entire park is 5 mph. Please drive slowly and watch out for children and pets.
- TRASH should be put in dumpsters as indicated on the Site Map. Please keep your site clean and leave it as you found it.
- PETS are the responsibility of their owner. Please be courteous and clean up after your pet. We are a pet friendly resort, but pets must be walked on a leash and may not disturb other guests. Management reserves the right to restrict disruptive or exotic pets. Please be courteous of other guests and use only roadways and access paths. Walking or biking through campsites is prohibited.
- WASHING YOUR VEHICLE at your site is not permitted unless approved by the park manager. Please help us conserve water. The number of people on your site may be regulated by park management.
- GREY WATER must be contained and disposed of at the dump station it's the
- STRICTLY PROHIBITED items or actions include: firearms, fireworks (including firecrackers), loud or disorderly conduct and foul language.
- MOTORCYCLES may only be driven from the park office/registration area to vour site.

WAUBEEKA'S HIDDEN HISTORY: A PIECE OF CAMP WAUBEEKA'S PAST.

Before the brush and weeds were cleared away in preparation for the upcoming camping season, one of the property's old entrances on Farm Road, a stone gate almost certainly goes back to at least the 1930s when Waubeeka was a Boy Scout camp. Camp Waubeeka Boy Scout Camp operated from 1928 through the 1970's. In 1928, Westchester's former Bronx River Boy Scout Council bought 150 acres in Copake to establish a camp. The boys stayed in platform tents in the fields and woods or in open faced lean-tos. Camp Waubeeka Boys Scout Camp, one of three racially integrated camps, had none of the elaborate sports and other facilities of private camps. The boys swam in the camp's two ponds and hiked to Rudd Pond, Bash Bish Falls and other destinations. Waubeeka also offered classes to help the boys earn merit badges, particularly nature related ones. According to a 1940 newspaper article, a group of curious Scouts explored a "secret" cave close to the camp! Fast forward nearly a century later and you will still see the stone gate. As for the "secret" cave...mum's the word!
